Raising the roof

Our soon-to-be-completed Roman Gate Court development, which consists of 24 affordable apartments for over 55s, has been 'topped off' with the completion of its roof. With the building now watertight, internal works are now underway and it is firmly on-track for completion by Easter.

Nick Chambers, Chief Executive of LACE Housing, said:

"Situated at the gateway into the historic City of Lincoln, Roman Gate Court is becoming increasingly visible and it's generating much interest.

"Providing 24 apartments for over 55s at an affordable rent, I am delighted to confirm that Lindum Group is progressing well with works and completion remains on schedule.

"Once completed, Roman Gate Court will provide muchneeded affordable homes that support independent living, enabling people to stay in their local community as they grow older.

"Our homes are designed to be future proof for our

residents, as they can take advantage of enhanced services as and when they need them. The building itself will be energy efficient and built to a very high standard to ensure it stands the test of time."

Properties at Roman Gate Court will be available at an affordable rent and will be advertised through West Lindsey District Council's choice-based letting system at a later stage. Residents will be required to meet certain criteria, including having a connection to the local area.

We need you

Back in October and in the interests of openness – one of our six values, we as an Association strive for, Nick Chambers wrote to all residents about the increasing concerns associated with the impact of the current economic uncertainty upon our services, both now and in the future.

One of the many challenges we face is the rising cost of energy. In his letter, Nick provided some context about the electricity costs for the entire Association, currently £90,000 per annum. However, we had been advised that once our fixed-rate electricity contract came to an end in December 2022, this number would increase to an estimated £366,000 per annum (a rise of 407% or £276,000).

Nick welcomed residents to share their ideas and suggestions about how we could minimise the rising cost of providing services without adversely affecting the health, safety, and wellbeing of residents, visitors and staff.

We were extremely encouraged by the thoughtful responses we received from our residents. Reducing our energy usage was a popular suggestion across all of our schemes, and it is something we are now looking into as a priority whilst ensuring the health and safety of our residents remains paramount.

Similarly, during two Staff Away Days held in October, Nick asked staff for their views and ideas about how the Association could make efficiencies to minimise the rising cost of providing services to our residents. As before, reducing our energy usage was a popular suggestion, however, staff also identified ways to improve our use of information technology, increasing productivity and reducing our costs without compromising on our service.

We would like to thank all residents, including their friends and family, as well all of our staff members, who gave their time and suggestions in support of making LACE the best it can be.
